Vision

- What is the vision and goal of your ministry?
- How should it be accomplished and what should it look like?

Expectations

- What standards do you want to follow?
- What do you consistently want to happen?

People

- How are new people invited and involved?
- How are they trained and mentored in what the team is about?
- If someone moves on (move, sick, pass away, new ministry, etc.) will the ministry continue successfully?)

Processes/Systems

- What documents exist so everyone knows the right ways to accomplish all the tasks?
 - Consider all elements including advertising, recruiting, projects, events, tasks, yearly calendar, weekly calendar, task timeline, budgeting, training, etc.
- What documents create consistency and internal evaluation?
- What documents exist to facilitate shared work and delegation?

Feedback and Evaluation

- What systems exist to receive improvement from inside and outside your ministry?

Without releasing your inner “Entrepreneur” you won’t be clear about where you’re going, what you expect to happen along the way, how the team should proceed, what process you’ll use or how you can improve!
